This group of farm buildings includes a brick house with a recessed double porch along part of the front elevation, a frame bank barn and related out-buildings. The house is representative of a major architectural group in Washington County dating from the mid-19th century. Houses like this one with its recessed double porch which have been positively dated in Washington County were constructed between 1840 and 1860. Other evidence in this house such as the carpenter locks and the decorated corner blocks on interior woodwork suggests a construction date during the mid-19th century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located at the end of a short private lane leading in a northwesterly direction from Maryland Route 60, the Leitersburg Pike in Washington County, Maryland. The house is situated near the base of a small slope and faces south.

The dwelling is a two story, five bay brick structure painted white and set on stone foundations. The facade of the house includes a recessed double porch which contains the two eastern bays. A one story brick addition extends to the rear.

Flemish bond brickwork is displayed at the west end of the front or south elevation while American or common bond with five rows of stretchers between header courses is present at other walls. Flat arches of brick are present above the windows and doors. Other decorative masonry includes brick dentil work at the cornice. Above this is a corbel.

Windows have narrow rounded frames which hold modern single pane double hung sashes. Some windows have older six over six pane sashes. Several windows are flanked with pairs of three panel shutters. Others have hinge pins in their frames indicating that shutters were present at one time.

The main entrance is located in the second bay from the west end of the front elevation. The six panel door is hung beneath a three light transom. Other entrances open from the double porch. This porch is supported by chamfered square posts and enclosed with a wooden balustrade.

The roof is sheathed with red asphalt shingles and extends beyond the end walls. Brick chimneys are located inside each gable end.

The interior of the house has a door and window trim with symmetrical molding and decorated corner blocks. Interior doors have carpenter locks.

Near the house is a small one story, five bay frame secondary dwelling with concrete block end walls. Also present is a brick out kitchen which appears contemporary with the house. Southwest of the dwelling is a frame bank barn with louvered ventilators in its end walls and a metal cupola, also for ventilation, centered in the roof.

The buildings appear to be in excellent condition and stand on a tract containing 60.08 acres.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Other evidence in this house such as the carpenter locks and the decorated corner blocks on interior woodwork trim suggests a construction date during the mid-19th century.

This farm was for many years owned by the Trovinger family. Christopher Trovinger in his will dated August 16, 1820, left the property containing about 60 acres to his son Joseph, describing it as his place of residence (Will Liber C/129). The farm descended through the Trovinger family until 1934 when the heirs of Martin L. Trovinger sold it to Howard J. and V. B. Eckstine, who in 1959 conveyed it to Woodford T. and Bertha C. Norment.
