DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm complex is located at the end of a private lane which leads in a northwesterly direction from Maryland route 60, the Leitersburg Pike. The house is situated on high ground and faces south.

The dwelling is a two story, three bay brick structure sheathed with white brick siding. A two bay, two story ell with a double porch extends to the rear.

Windows have narrow frames and hold six over one pane modern sashes and six over six pane sashes at the second story level. A projecting bay is present at the first story toward the north end of the east gable elevation.

The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. It is framed similarly to the windows and includes a four light transom. Oval panels trim the door jambs. A wide one story porch supported by large square posts extends along the south and east elevations.

The roof is covered with sheet metal and terminates with barge boards set directly against the end walls. Several courses of molding finish the eaves. Brick chimneys are located inside each gable end.

East of the house is a frame bank barn set on fieldstone foundations.

The buildings are in excellent condition and stand on a tract containing 166.20 acres.




