This stone and brick farmhouse and frame bank barn reflect building traditions from the 18th and 19th centuries in Washington County. Certain architectural features in the stone section in particular can be associated with 18th century construction in the area. Among these is the use of rocks and mortar as insulation between the cellar joists and the first floor boards. Also characteristic of late 18th or early 19th century work is the arched chimney pier in the cellar with dressed voussoirs and the use of wide, pegged window frames. The brick section of the house would appear to date from the early part of the second quarter of the 19th century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm group is located at the end of a private lane which extends in a westerly direction from the Maugansville Road, about one mile south of Maugansville in Washington County, Maryland.

The house is a two story, five bay, two part stone and brick structure built on gently sloping ground. It faces south. The stone or eastern section would appear to be the older part, consisting of three bays with an entrance in the west bay of its front wall. The roughly coursed stone work has been painted white. Flat arches are present above first story windows.

Windows appear to be spaced evenly in this section of the house. They all have wide frames joined at the corners with wooden pegs and trimmed with quarter round molding. Nine over six light sashes are used at all elevations. Hinge pins are retained in all window frames indicating that shutters were present at one time. The main entrance has been faced with modern neo-colonial trim. At the rear of the house another entrance is located opposite the front door, with framing matching that of the windows.

The cellar of the stone section features an arched chimney pier with carefully cut radiating voussoirs. The first floor framing consists of heavy joists supporting planks upon which rests a layer of rocks and mortar, presumably for insulation.

The brick portion or western two bays of the house rests on fieldstone foundations. The bricks, painted white are laid in Flemish bond at the front elevation with common bonding at the side and rear walls. Flat arches are present above the original openings. Windows have narrow frames which hold nine over six pane sashes at the first story level and six over six sashes at the second story.

The roof of the entire building is sheathed with slate terminating with barge boards set directly against the end walls. The eaves are finished with boxing under which runs a course of molding. Large brick chimneys are located inside each gable end.

Just west of the house is a large frame bank barn which faces south. Other sheds and out-buildings are located nearby.

The structures are in excellent condition and stand on a farm containing 104.69 acres.


