DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located on the north side of Spade Road about one and a half miles west of Maryland Route 63, west of Hagerstown in Washington County. The buildings are situated on a hillside at the end of a private lane with the house facing east and the barn south.

The house is a two story, four bay log and frame structure resting on fieldstone foundations. Thickness of the exterior walls at the door and window jambs suggests that the two northern bays are of log construction while the two more southern bays are a frame addition. The entire structure is sheathed with asbestos shingles. A modern one story garage is attached to the north end wall and a porch has been added to the front elevation.

Windows and doors appear to be aligned with each other in the walls, although there is some variation in window placement between the north and south sections. Windows in the north section have six over six pane sashes held within wide frames trimmed with ogee molding. In the south section windows have two over two pane sashes within plain casings. Entrances are located in the front or east elevations. The main door has six raised panels.

The roof of the house is sheathed with corrugated sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls. A modern exterior stone chimney is located at the north end wall. A small brick flue extends from the interior of the house at a point where the log and frame sections join.

North of the house is a frame bank barn.

The buildings appear to be in good to excellent condition and are located on a farm containing 137.5 acres.
