**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This farm complex is located at the end of a long private lane extending in an easterly direction from Maryland route 63, the Williamsport-Greencastle, Pa. pike. The buildings are situated on rolling limestone farmland located about three miles west of Hagerstown in Washington County. The house stands on a rise of ground and faces west.

The dwelling is a one and a half story limestone structure constructed of roughly coursed native stone. It is an L-shaped building with a wing extending to the east and a modern frame addition to the south. The gables of the stone section are of frame construction, sheathed with wooden siding. The front elevation is one and a half stories high while the side or north wall is two and one half stories in height with a fully exposed ground or lower level. No decorative masonry is associated with the windows or doors. There is evidence of extensive repointing in the west wall. Modern porches extend along the south and east walls.

Windows in the front elevation of the main story have nine over six pane double hung sashes held within narrow frames. Elsewhere at the main story six over six sashes are used. Six-light windows are present at the upper story. Modern slatted shutters are attached to the wall beside the windows.

The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. The door has six low relief panels hung beneath a diamond paned transom. Eighteenth century style trim has been installed around the opening.

The roof is sheathed with corrugated sheet metal and terminates with gables at the east and south ends of the building. At the northwest corner of the building the roof has a hip joint. Brick chimneys extend from inside the south end wall, inside the east end wall, just north of the roof peak and from inside the north elevation near the west end.

A frame bank barn resting on coursed fieldstone foundations is located east of the house. Numerous fieldstone fences stand on the farm. Some appear to mark the course of a roadway which presumably led north from present-day route 40. The right-of-way for this road is described in deeds for this property.

The buildings appear to be in good condition. The farm contains 180.5 acres.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Included in this farm group is a one and a half story L-shaped stone dwelling with a modern frame addition and a frame bank barn. The house has been altered extensively but would appear to date from the second quarter of the 19th century as suggested by the method of stone masonry, and window and door framing. The house and the fieldstone fences which mark roadways and field borders on the property illustrate the importance of the native limestone as a building material during the first half of the 19th century in Washington County.

The 180 acre farm on which the buildings stand includes parts of the land grants, "Bachelor's Delight," "Felty's Fortune" and "Felty's Addition to Dear Bought." During much of the 19th century it was owned by John Troup who acquired the farm in a series of transactions between 1829 and 1876. The farm was sold out of the Troup family in 1904 (120/77). It was purchased by the present owner in 1952.




