This two story log house and the two pen log barn which stands near it provide an example of the wood folk architecture popular in Washington County during the 18th and 19th centuries. Log was the major construction material here from the pioneer times into the 1800's. In the slate hills along the Conococheague Creek, where good building stone was not present, wood construction was particularly prevalent. Although log barns were apparently once numerous in Washington County, few of these structures are to be seen today.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story log house and log barn are located on the north side of Mt. Tabor Road, just west of Kaiser Ridge Road, near the Conococheague Creek, west of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The buildings are situated on high slate land with the house facing east and the barn, north.

The house is a two story, three bay structure sheathed with composition siding. It has two windows at the second story of the front elevation while three openings are present at the first story level. A two bay, one story shed roofed frame addition is attached to the south end wall. Another one story addition is attached to the north wall.

Windows have two over two pane double hung sashes and are trimmed with turn of the century period architraves with a back band across the top piece. The main entrance is located in the middle bay of the front elevation.

Just south of the house is a two pen log barn sheathed with vertical board siding. Where logs are exposed, "V" notched corner joining is evident.

The buildings appear to be in good condition and stand on a property containing 28.22 acres.


