DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the east side of Kamps Mill Road in the settlement of Kamps Mill north of Williamsport in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on an area of level ground near the Conococheague Creek and faces west.

The structure is a two story, three bay brick house resting on low stone foundations. Attached to the rear wall are brick and frame additions. The bricks forming the main part of the house are laid in American bond with generally seven courses of stretchers between header rows. Flat arches are present above the windows and doors. A semi hexagonal one story projecting bay is located at the south end of the front elevation.

Windows appear to be arranged symmetrically in the walls. First story windows are larger than those at the second story level and all have pairs of shutters with movable louvers. Narrow window casings hold two over two pane sashes. The main entrance is centered in the front elevation. It is framed similarly to the windows and includes a transom. Along the entire front wall is an early twentieth century style porch supported by tapered square pillars resting on brick piers.

The roof is of standing seam tin with framing which extends beyond the end walls of the house. A plain frieze is attached beneath the cornice molding. Small brick chimneys are located on each side the end walls. The northern chimney has white bricks set in a cross pattern in the flues of the chimney.

The house is said to be dated 1876. Behind it are a series of outbuildings and sheds. The property contains about nine acres.

This two story three bay brick house was built in 1876. It displays a number of architectural characteristics associated with rural building from the late 19th century. Among these is the use of American bond at all elevations patterned with eight courses of stretchers between header rows, the projecting bay at part of the front elevation and the window and roof treatment.


