DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmhouse is located west of I-81 just north of its junction with I-70 off Stottler Road, between Williamsport and Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The house is now offices for a large mobile home park, Lakeside Village. It faces east. Barns and outbuildings which were once part of this farm complex have been removed.

The house which stands on relatively level ground is a two story, three bay brick structure resting on low fieldstone foundations. A two story, three bay ell or wing is located at the rear. At one time a recessed double porch extended along the north elevation of the wing. Recently the second story porch was removed and two story square pillars were installed to support the roof. The entire structure has been painted white.

Bricks display Flemish bonding at the front elevation and American or common bonding at the side and rear walls with, generally, five courses of stretchers between header rows. Flat arches are present above original windows and doors at the two main stories.

Openings are aligned with each other in the walls. Windows have narrow rounded casings which hold six over six pane double hung sashes. Some retain their original shutters which at the first story have three panels and at the second story are louvered. Windows in the wing are smaller in size than those in the main section. Full size windows are present in the gal of the front part as well.

The main entrance is located in the north end bay of the east elevation. The door is trimmed similarly to the windows and has six panels with applied molded trim. Above the door is a three light transom. There is now no porch or entrance shelter.

The roof is sheathed with modern asphalt shingles and terminates with tapered beaded barge boards set directly against the end walls. A double brick chimney is located inside the south end wall and a large chimney, also of brick extends from the north end wall of the ell.

At the interior, the house has a wide entrance hall with a stair. Decorative work has been applied to the ends of the risers and a large round newel post begins the hand rail. The hallway is lit by a window in the north end wall. Doors are trimmed with corner blocks.

The house appears to be in excellent condition and stands on a tract containing 62.62 acres.


