DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmhouse is located on the east side of old Maryland Route 63 just south of the point where the Western Maryland Railroad crosses the road north of Williamsport in Washington County. It faces west.

Resting on moderately high fieldstone foundations, the house is a two story, three bay brick structure which has been painted white. Flemish bonding was used at the front elevation while other walls display American or common bond brick work. Flat arches are present above the openings. A modern frame one story addition and sun porch are attached to the rear or east elevation of the house.

Windows and doors are aligned with each other in the walls. They have narrow casings finished with a bead at the inside edge. Windows at the front elevation have nine over six pane double hung sashes while those elsewhere have six over six sashes. A double sashed window is present in the south gable end at the attic level. Several windows retain louvered shutters. The main entrance is located in the south end bay of the front elevation. The door is hung beneath a transom with a combination of diamond shaped and square panes.

Extending across most of the front elevation is a one story porch resting on brick piers supported by square pillars.

The roof is sheathed with sheet metal and terminates with barge boards set directly against the end walls. At the front elevation, the eaves are finished with a brick corbel and a course of bricks protruding at an angle. Large double brick chimneys are constructed inside the north end wall.

Various sheds and outbuildings are located behind the house. It is in good condition and stands on a property containing 6.2 acres.




