DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the west side of Doub Road near the point where it makes a sharp bend to the northwest, east of Williamsport and the Penn Central Railroad tracks in Washington County, Maryland. The house is situated on a slight rise of ground and faces southwest.

The structure is a one and a half story brick dwelling resting on fieldstone foundations which become almost a full story in height at the west corner of the house. The house is three bays in length and one bay wide. The window toward the south corner of the front elevation has been enclosed with brick. The house displays Flemish bonding at the front elevation and common bonding at the other walls. Under the main roof span at both the front and rear elevations are porches. To the porch at the rear has been added a modern frame extension. The front porch which extends along the entire front elevation rests on brick piers except where a stone foundation, more recent than the house foundations supports the roof. The posts are turned with curved brackets at their tops. A decorative scroll cut frieze spans the area between the posts. Most of the porch is enclosed with a plain balustrade. The surface of the house has been painted red. The only decorative masonry observed were segmental arches consisting of a double row of header bricks at cellar level openings.

Most windows show evidence of having been rebuilt or altered. Some contain two over two pane double hung sashes. In the southeast gable wall, a modern double window has been installed. In the southwest slope of the roof are a pair of gable roofed dormers. The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation.

The roof is sheathed with asphalt shingles and extends beyond the end walls of the house. A moderately large brick chimney is located inside the northwest end wall. A patch in the roof inside the southeast end wall could indicate that a chimney was there at one time.

The house appears to be in good condition and stands on a lot containing 2.78 acres, part of a large 18th century proprietary holding called "Conococheague Manor."

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house, a one and a half story dwelling built of brick, may date from the third quarter of the 19th century. It has a Victorian porch along its entire front elevation and apparently had one at the back of the house as well. A long, narrow house, relatively low in height, its form is somewhat unusual among Washington County's vernacular dwellings.

This house was part of the estate of William Bowers who died about 1875. In February of 1876, his heirs divided his property into five lots containing 10 or more acres. The property changed hands numerous times during the early 20th century.


