DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm complex is located on the west side of Bower Road, south of I-70 near Halfway, south of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The buildings are situated on level ground with the house and barn each facing east.

The house is a two story, four bay brick structure resting on low fieldstone foundations. A one story, two bay wing is attached to the south gable end. At the front elevation of the wing the original overhang has been enclosed and a newer one story porch added which extends along the front elevation of the entire structure. In the main section, bricks forming the front wall are laid in Flemish bond, while those at the other elevations and the wing display American bonding with five courses of stretchers between header rows. Flat arches are present above the openings. The front elevation and part of the south end wall have been painted red.

Openings are aligned with each other in the walls. Windows have narrow casings and hold two over two pane double hung sashes. Several pairs of louvered shutters are retained. The main entrance is located in the second bay from the south end of the front elevation. The door is trimmed similarly to the windows and includes a narrow transom. The porch extending across the front of the house rests on a concrete slab base with partial brick piers supporting wooden posts.

The house is roofed with sheet metal and has barge boards which are placed directly against the end walls. Brick chimneys are located inside the gable elevations.

Some distance southwest of the house is a frame bank barn with decorative metal ventilator cupolas. Small frame sheds and outbuildings are located between the house and barn.

The buildings appear to be in excellent condition and stand on a tract containing 27.81 acres.




