DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the east side of Doub Road at the point where it makes a sharp bend to the west just west of Maryland Route 632, the Downsville Pike, south of Hagerstown in Washington County. It is situated on an area of high ground and faces east.

The dwelling is a two story, four bay structure, presumably built of logs and sheathed with composition siding. A one story frame addition extends to the north. Although its actual construction cannot be seen, the thickness of the house walls at the window and door jambs would suggest the possibility of a log building.

Windows and doors are aligned with each other in the walls. The four bays are grouped with pairs of openings set toward each end of the front elevation, the space between the second and third bays being slightly wider than that between the others. All windows have six over six pane double hung sashes held within frames with plain architraves. Simple doors without transoms are located in the two center bays of the front elevation. One door has four panels while the other is newer with a large glass upper section. The two front doors and the south end wall are sheltered by a one story shed roof porch supported by turned posts resting on a concrete slab.

The roof is sheathed with asphalt shingles and extends beyond the end walls of the house. The eaves are finished with plain boxing. A small brick chimney is located inside the south end wall and another slightly larger is located in the north end.

The house appears to be in excellent condition and stands on a tract containing 31.84 acres.


