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**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This house is located on the south side of Kemp's Mill Road just east of the mill and west of Maryland Route 63 north of Williamsport in Washington County. It stands on level ground east of the Conococheague Creek and faces north. A two story, three bay brick structure, the house rests on low fieldstone foundations and has a frame leanto addition at the rear. The entire structure has been painted white and is built of bricks laid in common bond at all elevations. The house is long and narrow with a large area of wall between the openings. Flat arches of brick are present above the windows and doors. According to the present owner, the second story of the house was added.

Windows and doors are aligned with each other in the walls. They have narrow casings finished with a bead at the inside edge. Six over six pane sashes are present at the first story while two over two or two over one pane sashes were used above. The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation and shows evidence of having had a transom. A hipped roof porch supported by turned posts shelters the door.

The roof is sheathed with modern asphalt shingles and extends beyond the end walls. Brick chimneys with several courses of corbeling at their tops are located inside the east end wall and at the interior of the house between the first and second bays from the west end.

The house appears to be in excellent condition and stands on a lot containing 2.6 acres.


