DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmstead is located at the end of a private lane which extends in a southerly direction from College Road, east of St. James School southwest of Hagerstown in Washington County. The house is situated on a slope and faces east.

The dwelling is a two story, five bay brick structure resting on fieldstone foundations which become almost a full story in height at the front elevation. The southern two bays of the front elevation are located beneath a recessed double porch which is included under the main roof span. The walls display American or common bonding at all elevations with five courses of stretchers between header rows. Flat arches of brick are present above the window and door openings.

The openings are not spaced symmetrically in the walls. All have narrow frames with windows having six over six pane double hung sashes. Hinge pins remaining in the window frames indicate that shutters were present at one time. The principal entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. The door has six panels and is hung beneath a plain rectangular transom. Other entrances are located within the double porch. This porch is supported by chamfered square posts with brackets and is spanned at the upper level by a series of flat scroll cut balusters. The lower section of the porch is enclosed with glass.

Along the entire front elevation is a concrete block slab or deck.

The roof is sheathed with slates and terminates with barge boards set directly against the end walls. Brick chimneys are located inside the end walls and at the interior of the house near the north end of the recessed porch.

South of the house is a one story stone springhouse with a steeply pitched gable roof. Also present is a frame bank barn and related outbuildings. The complex appears to be in good condition and stands on a tract containing 178.75 acres.

Presumably this land was purchased in the 1840's by John Rowland in various transactions, from Sophia Fitzhugh who owned the portion of Conococheague Manor on which St. James School now stands.
