**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This farmstead is located at the end of a private lane which extends in a northwesterly direction from College Road near St. James in Washington County, Maryland. The buildings are situated on a ridge west of Marsh Run and the Norfolk and Western Railroad tracks. The house faces north and the barn east.

The house is a two story, six bay stuccoed and brick sheathed building with a recessed double porch along part of the front elevation. The four western bays at the south elevation and the west end wall show a veneer of bricks which have been painted white. The rest of the building has a stucco coating. Door and window jambs are thick, but the construction material beneath the stucco and brick surfaces were not observable. The house is built on a slope so that its east end wall is a full three stories in height. The lower level of the double porch at the front elevation has been enclosed with German siding.

Windows have narrow frames finished with a bead at the inside edge. They have two over two pane double hung sashes some of which retain pairs of louvered shutters. Entrances appear to be framed similarly to the windows and are located at both levels of the double porch and in the rear of the house in the fourth bay from the west end. Six panel doors are used. Screens are hung beneath three light transoms. A small hipped roof entrance porch is present at the south elevation.

The roof is sheathed with asphalt shingles and extends beyond the end walls of the house. A large stuccoed chimney is located inside the east end wall and a smaller chimney, also stuccoed, is located inside the west end. A small flue of brick rises from the interior of the house near the point where the wall is recessed for the double porch.

Just east of the house is a two story, three bay stone outbuilding or secondary dwelling with a brick chimney in its south end wall. This building faces away from the main house with its entrance centered in the east wall. It has massive window and door frames with pegged mortise and tenon joints. The west slope of its roof shows the remains of wooden shingles. Southeast of the house is a brick outkitchen. To the north is a large stone end bank barn with a rectangular space for a tablet which is missing high in the south gable. A stone fence encloses the barnyard. The buildings appear to be in fair condition and are part of a 133.31 acre farm.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This farmstead consists of a stuccoed and brick cased two story house, six bays in length with a recessed double porch along part of the front elevation, a stone end barn and stone and brick outbuildings. The house would appear to date from the 19th century, but alterations to its exterior makes a more specific assessment of its age difficult without further examination. Deeds indicate that during the mid 19th century the farm was owned by the Rowland family, being sold in 1877 by John E. Rowland to Daniel Wolfe for \$12,834. The relatively high price for the land would suggest that substantial improvements were present at the time of the sale. The property remained in the Wolfe family until 1938 (75/356, 111/678, 205/581). The farm includes parts of the land grants "Conococheague Manor" and "Agreed in Peace."


