DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the east side of the Sharpsburg Pike, Maryland Route 65 at College Road in Washington County. It faces west. It is a two story, three bay brick dwelling resting on low stone foundations. A two story, two bay all extends to the rear. The entire structure is painted red.

American or common bonding was used at all elevations with windows and doors trimmed with wide wooden lintels. Openings appear to have been arranged symmetrically with two over two pane sashes used throughout. Pairs of shutters with movable louvers are used at each window. The frames are narrow with rounded surfaces. The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation and includes a transom above the door. A one story porch on concrete block foundations extends across the front of the house. It is supported by large doric type pillars and is partially enclosed by a plain balustrade.

The roof is sheathed with standing seam sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls. A brick chimney with corbels at its top is located inside the south end wall. A modern exterior flue has been added against the north end.

The house appears to be in excellent condition and stands on a lot containing 1.18 acres. According to the present owner, the house was built by George Snodderly in 1881. The owner also reported that Snodderly's blacksmith shop was located just north of the house and a Brethren church once stood to the south of the building.

Frame sheds and small outbuildings are located behind the house.


