DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located on a long private lane which leads in an easterly direction from the Hagerstown-Boonsboro Road, alternate route 40, south of Funkstown in Washington County, Maryland. At one time the lane continued in a northeasterly direction to present route 40. The house and barn are situated on relatively level ground and face east.

The house is a two story, six bay log dwelling completely cased with bricks. The two south bays at the second story are of solid brick construction above a one story log building. The structure rests on low fieldstone foundations. The walls display stretcher bond at all elevations except at the upper part of the south end wall where American or common bonding is used. Flat arches of brick are present above all windows. The two southern bays of the front elevation are recessed beneath a double porch which is included under the main roof span.

Openings are aligned with each other in the walls, but are not arranged symmetrically. Windows have narrow casings which hold six over six pane double hung sashes. Some retain louvered shutters. The main entrance is located in the third bay from the north end of the front elevation. The six panel door is cased similarly to the windows and is hung beneath a transom. A similar door is located in the second bay from the north end of the west elevation. Both doors are sheltered by a one bay hipped roof porch supported by chamfered square posts with curved brackets.

The roof is sheathed with sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls. Small brick chimneys are located inside the end walls and at the interior wall which bisects the house between the second and third bays from the south end.

The interior of the house is divided into four rooms at the first story. The front and rear entrances both lead into a large room which also contains the stair located in the southeast corner where it rises diagonally across a window. The interior woodwork includes six panel doors with casings trimmed with plain corner blocks.

Immediately southeast of the house are ruins of a brick washhouse or outkitchen. Further to the south is a frame bank barn resting on fieldstone foundations. Louvered ventilators with Victorian period applied trim are spaced at intervals in the wall.

At the time this complex was photographed in 1975, the buildings were in deteriorated to fair condition. The property contains slightly more than 114 acres.

The farm includes parts of the land grants "Eacharts Industry" and "Marchy's Hope." For most of the second half of the 19th century and the early 20th century it was owned by various generations of the Welty family.
