DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the north side of Mt. Aetna Road, west of U.S. Route 40 on a wedge of land between these two roads. It stands on a hill and faces south. Resting on stone foundations, the house is a two story, five bay wooden building sheathed with German siding and composition siding. A two story, three bay ell with a double porch along its east elevation extends to the rear or north. To this is attached a one story, one bay balloon frame outkitchen with a large fireplace inside its north end wall.

The construction material used in the house was not observed, however, thick walls as seen at door and window jambs suggests the possibility of log construction. A pointed wall dormer appears to have been added to the south slope of the roof.

Windows and doors are arranged symmetrically at the front elevation. At the front section of the house first story windows have nine over nine pane sashes while nine over six pane sashes are used at the second story level. Elsewhere at the main two floors, six over six sashes are used. Most windows in the front section retain wide frames with hinge pin for shutters remaining.

The main entrance is centered in the front elevation. A turn-of-the-century door is hung beneath a three light transom in a frame that matches that of the windows. A one story porch supported by fluted doric columns extends across the front elevation. At the north and east elevations doors are located at both levels of the double porch.

Large brick chimneys are located inside the end walls of the front section. Just above the foundations in the east and west end walls are exposed fire box backs of brick. The chimneys are large with several courses of corbeling at their tops. The roof is sheathed with composition shingles and extends beyond the east and west end walls.

Behind the house is a brick smokehouse with a door having six raised panels. It is possible that this door was taken from another location.

The house appears to be in fair to good condition. It has been made into apartments.






