## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located at the end of a private lane which extends in a westerly direction from the Marsh Pike between Hagerstown and Paramount in Washington County, Maryland. The house and barn are situated on an area of level ground and each face east.

The house is a two story, four bay brick building with a two story, two bay ell to the rear or west which was extensively renovated about 1950. The house rests on coursed fieldstone foundations. Bricks forming the walls are laid in American or common bond at all elevations. Flat arches of long angle cut bricks are present above the doors and windows.

Windows and doors are aligned with each other in the walls. They have narrow mitered frames finished with a bead at the inside edge. Original windows have nine over six pane double hung sashes with hinge pins for shutters remaining in the frames. The main entrance is located in the second bay from the south end of the front elevation. A three light transom is present above the door. Resting on old concrete slab is a one bay flat roofed entrance porch with Victorian brackets below its cornice.

The roof is sheathed with standing seam sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls. Br chimneys are located inside the gables.

The interior of the house has six-panel doors. The main stair is finished with a delicate rail and is located parallel to the front wall in the southeast corner.

Behind the house is a brick summer kitchen. To its north is a large brick end bank barn with geometric ventilator openings.

The property contains 130.58 acres.
