DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmstead is located at 500 Northern Avenue just north of the city limits of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The house is a two story limestone structure with a two story brick addition and faces east. The barn is frame and faces south.

The house is built of roughly coursed stone with the original pointing replaced with raised grapevine joints. It is five bays long and two bays wide. The main entrance is centered in the front elevation. The openings have narrow rounded frames which hold six over six pane double hung sashes. Hinge pins for shutters remain.

Extending across the front elevation is a one story porch which appears to date from the Victorian period.

The brick addition has a shed roof and is painted grey. Its windows have segmentally arched heads lined with a double course of header bricks. A modern porch has been added to the front or east elevation.

Brick chimneys are located inside the end walls of the stone section. The sheet metal roof extends beyond the end walls.

Behind the house is a stone outbuilding which may have been a secondary dwelling. It is dated 1849. Also present is a small stone springhouse which is dated 1840.

The buildings appear to be in excellent condition and are part of a farm containing 59.202 acres. The house now contains several apartments. There is considerable commercial and residential development surrounding the property.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This farm complex is adjacent to the northern boundary of the city of Hagerstown. Most of the buildings are of stone construction and would appear to date from the second quarter of the 19th century. The house is representative of a major architectural type in the Cumberland Valley, being built of this native stone and following the five bay, central entrance plan.

The farm, containing 290 acres was in the Schindel family from the mid 19th century until 1963 (163/659). Apparently Samuel Schindel and others of his family acquired the land in various transactions. A sizable portion was conveyed by David Zeller to Samuel Schindel on April 1, 1853 (IN7/570). The only land tract name mentioned in the deeds was "Fountain Head."
