DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Charles Hykes House is a two story frame house dating from the late nineteenth century, located on the west side of Antietam Drive just south of the village of Fiddlersburg near the northwest boundary of Hagerstown, Maryland.

The main elevation, facing east, is three bays wide and has a one-story porch which extends around to the south elevation. The porch roof is supported on turned columns with recessed-arch paneled pedestal bases.

The windows are mostly 2/2 in arched sliding sash frames. Several second story windows have been altered or replaced with modern aluminum sash.

The exterior is covered with asbestos siding in a brick pattern. The gable roof is standing seam metal. A concrete block interior end chimney is located at the south gable end, probably replacing an earlier brick stack.


