The Stockslager House is a good example of Queen Anne-Shingle Style architecture in a semi-rural location. While not as elaborate as town houses of the same style and period, the Stockslager House is typical of many houses for less wealthy but prosperous farmers living near towns.

The house has an irregular plan and its elevations reflect the picturesque quality of the Queen Anne style. Polygonal bays, shingled gables, and a Palladian-inspired window provide the diversified aspect typical of late Victorian period architecture.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Stockslager House is a two story brick house dating from the late nineteenth century located on the southeast side of Leitersburg Road (MD. 60) just south of the intersection of Longmeadow Road.

The house has an irregular plan and elevations. The main facade has three bays with the northern bay projecting and polygonal shaped. A one story porch extends across the other two bays. The center bay contains the entrance. The polygonal bay has a shingled gable and overhanging eaves. In the shingled gable is a tripartite arched window of "Palladian" inspiration.

The foundation is stone and the gable roof is slate with metal snow stops along the edges. The fenestration is 1/1 and is set in arched openings. The porch roof is supported on plain unfluted columns on brick piers.

The house is located on a slight rise above the road and a flight of concrete steps leads up to the house from the road. Large evergreen trees flank the entrance, almost blocking view of the house.


