DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The house at 5 Longmeadow Road, Hagerstown is a two story brick duplex residence with a one story porch and is located on the north side of Longmeadow Road one-half block west of the intersection of MD. 60 (March Pike).

The main elevation faces south and has three irregular bays. The first floor has two entries with a window on the outermost bays. The second floor has three 2/2 windows in arched openings with shutters.

The first floor porch has a shed roof and unfluted columns. Lattice infill frames arched openings in each outer bay of the porch.

The roof is gabled and is covered in slate with iron snow stops. Interior end chimneys with corbeled tops break the ridge line at each gable end. The side elevations have two bays each.

A one story garage of the early twentieth century is located immediately northeast of the house.


