The frame bungalow is a one and one-half story, three-bay by three-bay structure on a concrete foundation. It has a wide-pitched gable roof which flairs out to form a porch on the front of the house. On the front of the roof is a large gable dormer and on the rear is a shed dormer. The rear of the building has a one-story addition which gives the house a rectangular plan. It appears to have been built in the early 20th century.

The bungalow is located on the east side of Rt. 65, .2 mile south of Poffenberger Road. It is located on fairly level land at a curve in the road.

The main facade has rusticated block porch supports with boarded posts and stick railings. Lattice work forms an arch at the ends of the porch. The side entrance on the main facade has a molded door frame. The roof is covered in asphalt shingles. The first floor contains two-section windows on all sides, with three-over-one sash on the northern facade. The rear bay contains a projecting window with shed roof.

There is a hipped roof concrete block garage on the property.


