The brick bungalow is a one and one-half story, three-bay by two-bay house. It has a gable roof with a central dormer. The main facade has a central entrance with a two-bay porch in the southernmost bays. The date of construction is early 20th century.

The brick bungalow is located on the east side of Rt. 65 at the intersection with College Avenue. It is part of a farm complex that sits on a slight rise about ¼ mile off of Rt. 65. The main facade faces west.

The brickwork is stretcher bond. The main facade has a three-section window in the southernmost bay and a two-section window in the northernmost bay. The porch has a hipped roof covered in sheet metal. An interior-end chimney rises from the south gable end.

There are several farm buildings that date from the same time period on the property. There is a concrete block barn with a gable roof. A large silo adjoins the barn. Also, there are rusticated concrete block sheds.


