Description:

This small commercial building is a one story, three bay gable fronted structure, of frame construction with German siding. Window have two over two pane sash within "Gothic" architraves with pointed tops. The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. It is a wide entrance with a two-leafed door and a three light transom.

This building is significant as a commercial structure from the late 19th century, representing that time period in Funkstown. It retains a high level of integrity.

The building is not shown on the 1877 Atlas for Washington County. The lot on which it stands was owned in 1877 by H. Schieldtknecht.


