Approximate date C. 1830-1850

Description:

This four bay, two story brick house appears to date from the second quarter of the 19th century with modifications in the Italianate style dating from the later 19th century. The house has a Flemish bond facade with four bays and two central front doors. The roof is nearly flat with a prominent cornice with paired brackets. Windows have narrow frames beneath splayed brick headers. Two over two light sash are used. The two front doors apparently originally had transoms.

According to the 1877 Atlas map for Funkstown, the building on this site was a store owned by Mrs. Williams. This building appears residential in character. It may originally have been a gable roofed structure, modified with Italianate features during the late 19th century. The building suggests the 19th century prosperity of Funkstown.




