Description:

Known as the Angela Kirkham Davis House, this structure is a two story, five bay brick building with a Flemish bond facade. Windows have six over six light sash within narrow frames. There are pairs of paneled shutters with three panels each at the first floor and louvered shutters at the second story level. The door is in the central bay of the front elevation and is surrounded by a transom and sidelights. This was the home of Angela Kirkham Davis who chronicled her experiences as a Union sympathizer living in Funkstown during the Civil War. She describes the town, its people and the tremendous amount of troop activity during the Maryland Campaign in 1862.

Her husband operated a general store in Funkstown. The house served as a hospital after the Battle of Antietam and also after the Battle of Funkstown in 1863. The building's appearance reflects the 1830s when many of the buildings along Funkstown's main street was constructed and relates to the prominence of the National Pike in the first half of the 19th century. The back wing is said to be much older.

In 1877, according to the Atlas of that year, the place was owned by D. Schindel.




