Description:

Currently known as the Edmar Manor Bed and Breakfast, this is a stuccoed house, presumably of stone and log construction which has been modified several times. An L-shaped structure with a combination gable and hip roof, it has five bays on the High Street facade and five on the Maple Street facade. The house has been unified by application of stucco. It has single pane sash windows, an added semi-hexagonal projecting bay and an early 20th century two story porch across the front. The present front entrance on the High Street side is surrounded by a transom and sidelights.

According to an article by Suzanne Woodring in the April/May, 1992 Cracker Barrel magazine (p. 10), the house was built of stone and log and dates from 1790. It was once a farmhouse which became incorporated into the village of Funkstown.

In the 1877 Atlas, the property is identified as belonging to Dr. R.M. Butler. A small building perhaps an office was shown directly on the corner and separated from the main house.




