Description:

A duplex built in the 1920s or '30s, this house has bungaloid and Dutch Colonial features. It is a one and a half story gambrel roofed structure four bays wide and with vinyl siding. Windows have single pane sash, and except for the two front windows are grouped in pairs or tripled. Square projecting bays extend from the end walls. There are two central front doors opening into each unit. Shed roofed dormers extend from the roof. A porch across the front is supported by square posts.

This house reflects the late development of Funkstown's side streets.


