Description:

This one and a half story, three bay log house is covered with German siding.

Windows have two over two pane sash. The main entrance is located in the first bay from the east end. The roof is of standing seam sheet metal. There are several extensions to the rear. The main character-defining feature is an Italianate influenced entrance porch, supported by square posts with curvilinear brackets. Exterior features suggest mid 19th century construction.

According to the 1877 Atlas, the house was occupied at that time by a Mrs. Hughes.




