Description:

Attached to its neighbor to the west is this two story, three bay brick house influenced by the Greek Revival and Italianate styles. The entire building is constructed in common bond. Windows have nine over six light sash beneath wide wood lintels with decorative corner blocks. The entrance is located in the west bay of the front elevation. It includes a transom and an Italianate porch with a concave hipped roof and wooden detail work executed to suggest iron work. This is a character-defining feature of the house. This appears to be a very intact example of an 1840s brick house. It is located prominently along the route of the National Pike.

According to the 1877 Atlas map, this house belonged to a Mrs. Friend.


