Description:

This brick Foursquare style house is transitional with influence from the Queen Anne style. It is a brick structure, three bays wide in all stretcher bond. Bricks are laid in all stretcher bond at the front elevation. There is a semi-hexagonal projecting bay at the west side of the first story and another at the east side of the second story. The second story bay window is beneath a projecting pediment. Windows have single pane sash beneath cast stone lintels. The house has the typical hipped roof and dormer window. The main entrance is in the east bay of the front elevation.

This is among the later houses to be found on Baltimore Street which was largely built up in the 18th and early 19th century.


