Description:

This two story, four bay frame double house is covered with aluminum siding. Windows have single pane sash. The two entrances are located in the central bays. Each one has a transom. Two gable roofed dormers with pediments project from the front slope of the roof. A porch supported by round columns extends across the front.

Built as a duplex around the turn of the century this house may have been associated with the nearby Funkstown Manufacturing Company.
