Description:

This stone house located along the National Pike probably dates from the 1930s. It is a two story stone structure, with three bays at the first story and four at the second story. First story windows have eight over eight light sash while those at the second story have six over six lights. The front entrance is located in the center bay and is sheltered by a gabled portico with an elliptically arched ceiling and paired columns. A crenelated stone fence probably dates from approximately the time of construction of the house. The house reflects the significance of the National Pike in the 20th century with the dominance of automobile travel.
