This two story four bay frame house is located on the south side of Eby Lane. It is covered with vinyl siding. The front elevation follows the window, door, door, window arrangement, one that is common in areas with a strong Pennsylvania German influence, such as Maugansville. At the second story level, there are only two windows, a design feature that seems to be associated with construction in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The house also has a two story extension to the rear. Windows have two over two pane sash within architraves with molded flat tops, an architrave design typical of the early 20th century. There is a hip roofed across-the-front porch supported by square posts. A brick chimney with a corbeled top is located inside the east gable end. Immediately behind the house is a one story, gable fronted summer kitchen with an interior brick chimney. A poured concrete retaining wall defines the front yard.


