This brick house, located on the east side of Village Mill Drive appears to date from the 1890s. It is a two story, four bay building constructed with common bonding with 6 or 7 rows of stretchers between header rows. Windows have single pane sash beneath segmental arched openings. There are two central front doors, each with a narrow transom. The house therefore has a window, door, door, window arrangement which is traditional among Pennsylvania Germans and was used from the 18th through the 20th centuries. Across the front is a hip roofed porch supported by turned posts. The roofing material is slate, and corbeled brick chimneys extend from inside each gable. There is a one story extension to the rear. This house retains a high level of integrity and reflects the conservative Germanic, Mennonite traditions that founded Maugansville.




