Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: (Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)

Structure No. 21042X0 is a 5-foot brick semi-circular arch that measures 20 feet wide under roadway. The arch is exposed on one side only and has radiating voussoirs and rubble spandrel. It has been extended with a corrugated metal pipe on the west side of the structure. Structure No. 21042X0 is located on MD 63 just north of Cearfoss and carries a branch of Tom's Run. The date of construction is not known, however, it was probably built in the early-mid 1800's when MD 63 (Greenscastle Pike) was constructed.

Although altered, Structure No. 21042X0 still retains its original brick arch and is significant for its method of construction. It is one of a limited number of surviving brick arch culverts. According to the Small Structures on Maryland's Roadways Historic Context Report, brick arches are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) under Criterion C.

Structure No. 21042X0 is not known to be associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of local, state or national history (criterion A); nor is it associated with the lives of persons significant in the local, state, or national past (criterion B); and it is not being evaluated under criterion D.




