The single-family dwelling at 371 Pangborn Blvd. in Hagerstown, Washington County, MD is located outside of the Hagerstown Historic District and is not considered eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The 2-1/2-story, American four-square type dwelling was constructed in the first quarter of this century. It is a 2-1/2-story, two-bay frame dwelling covered with a hipped roof with a hipped roof dormer on center. A one-story hipped roof porch, set upon brick piers and supporting tapered wood columns extends across the facade. As is typical of the form, the windows are grouped in pairs in one bay, though the original multi-paned sash have been replaced with 1/1 double hung sash. In addition a brick veneer emulating a raised foundation has been applied to a portion of the frame walls, while the rest of the wall surface has been clad with vinyl siding. Although this house would be considered a contributing resource within a designated historic district, it lacks the architectural distinctiveness and integrity to qualify for individual listing under Criterion C.

The property is not known to have associations with persons or events significant to our past and is thus not eligible under Criteria A or B.


