The house at 374 Pangborn Blvd., in Hagerstown, Washington County, MD is not located within the boundaries of the Hagerstown Historic District and is not individually eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The building is a 1-1/2-story frame bungalow, built in 1929. Although the dwelling is a relatively intact example of its type and retains its original materials, the building follows a common and ubiquitous 20th-century dwelling form and does not stand out as an exceptional example of its type, and thus does not qualify for listing on the National Register under Criterion C. The property is not known to have associations with persons or events significant to our past and therefore does not qualify for listing under Criteria A or B.




