This property was part of an estate owned by Reverend John Alexander Adams that was comprised of 177 1/2 acres. Adams acquired the estate from his wife, Mary Anna, the widow of Archibald Ritchie from whom she inherited the property in 1828. Adams and Mary Anna were married in 1832, and in 1856 Adams acquired sole possession of the estate. In 1881 the entire estate was sold to George Burgan as a result of a ruling in a court case that accused Adams of fraudulently obtaining the property from his wife. A January 1879 plat map filed with the records of the court case, recorded that the property contained two tenant houses and two mansion houses. The log cabin is most likely one of the tenant houses. The property was sold by Daniel Burgan to Charles F. Drenner in 1894, and it was owned by members of the Drenner family until 1940. The property was later sold to Charles D. Long and Marian L. Long from Martha Ruth Batt by deed dated September 15, 1969. The property was bordered on the west side by the C&O Canal, and although it was not associated with the canal, it was part of the historic scene of the canal.

DESCRIPTION

The property is developed by a log cabin, bank barn, and three outbuildings. The log cabin and barn are contributing parts of the historic scene; the three outbuildings are non-contributing structures. The log cabin is described in survey form WA-II-043. The barn is a small frame bank barn with a gable roof and a three-sided stone foundation. The barn dates from at least the end of the nineteenth century, for the floor joists for the second floor are hand hewn timbers.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small log structure is located west of Canal Road northwest of the village of Antietam at the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal National Park south of Sharpsburg in Washington County, Maryland.

Situated on level ground it is a one story cabin which may have been at one time used as a dwelling, set on low fieldstone foundations, its walls are constructed of round logs which are joined with V-notching at the corners. Mud and hair chinking surrounds nogging of wood chips and small sawed boards. Window and door openings have been reworked and the roof has been replaced. The roof ridge is supported by a log similar to those used to construct the walls. This log rests on a short cross beam which is notched to rest in turn upon two more logs which span the space between the end walls. Stonework appearing to be old foundations extends from the building and suggests the presence at one time of an attached structure. The original use and construction date of this building are not known at the present time. It appears to be in deteriorated to fair condition and stands on a four acre tract owned by the National Park Service.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This small undated cabin with exposed log construction is significant for its architecture as an example of a prominent building tradition in Washington County. Logs were used extensively for construction purposes from the earliest days of settlement in the first half of the 18th century through the 19th century. Many log structures remaining in the County are still in use although most are sheathed with various forms of siding or bricks. Unlike most log buildings in Washington County which display squared, hewn logs, this structure was made of round logs from which the bark was stripped.


