DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located about 1/8 mile east of U.S. Route 40-A near its junction with Maryland Route 68 in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on a slight rise of ground, facing southwest.

The structure is a five-bay, two-story brick dwelling with white trim. Built in two sections, the earlier portion of the house consist of the three northwest bays. The two bays at the southeast of the facade were apparently an addition.

The brick walls are set on local fieldstone foundations. The three bays of the original section are laid in flemish bond with the remaining facade and other walls displaying common bond brick work. Flat brick arches are present over window and door openings, although the arches associated with the openings of the addition are noticeably shorter than those of the original structure.

All windows at the two main stories of the house contain nine-over-six pane sashes. They are set in narrow frames and trimmed with simple molding.

Since the original main entrance appears to have been removed, the front door is now located in the addition. It is concealed behind an enclosed porch. At the rear of the addition, a very simple doorway with a narrow transom is present.

The roof covering is slate. A large brick chimney rises from inside the northwest gable end. Smaller flues of brick are located at the juncture of the two sections and inside the southeast gable end. The earlier section of the building has a brick cornice of projecting headers, while the later portion has a neoclassically inspired wooden trim at the eaves.

The house stands on property containing 122.09 acres. It is in good condition and is not at present in danger of destruction.

Located nearby is a large stone end barn. A date plaque topped by a dark fieldstone is set in the northwest end, near the gable.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is significant for its architecture. It is representative of Washington County's mid-19th century brick construction. Built as a unit, or in sections, houses with recessed double porches, such as this example, are a prominent building type in Washington County.

Also worthy of note is the large stone end barn of a type frequently found in the Cumberland Valley and Western Maryland.


