DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located along the east side of Maryland Route 66 at San Mar, about 2-1/2 miles north of Boonsboro in Washington County. It is situated along the edge of the road with its facade facing east or toward the road.

The building is a two-story, five-bay brick dwelling with dark green and white trim. The walls are laid in common bond above low fieldstone foundations. A vertical seam is evident in the brick work between the second and third bays from the north end of the house. The ~~seam~~ is present on both the front and rear elevations of the building, suggesting that an addition was attached. Flat brick arches are present over all windows at the first and second stories.

Window openings contain six-over-six pane sashes held in narrow frames finished with a bead. The windows are set on narrow sills. The openings in the facade are flanked by louvered shutters. Small four-light openings in the gables light the attic.

Two entrances are present in the front elevation, in the second and fourth bays. The doorway toward the south end of the house is the slightly more elaborate of the two although both are quite plain with a four-light transom above the doors.

The roof, which extends for several inches beyond the end walls of the house, is covered with sheet metal. The eaves boxing is finished with a band of molding. Brick chimneys rise from inside each gable end and from the interior of the building at the location of the seam in the masonry.

A one-story entrance porch sheds both doorways in the facade. A small one-story frame structure is attached to the rear of the building. The house is in fair condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The significance of this house lies in its architecture. It is typical of a type of building frequently found in the Cumberland Valley, in Central Pennsylvania and Western Maryland. Probably dating from the mid to late 19th century, the house appears to be of the I-form, one room in depth.

It stands on property belonging to the Fahrney-Keedy Memorial Home for the Aged, which opened in 1905. The property since about 1798 had belonged to several generations of the Fahrney family who engaged in the practice of medicine at the site of the present institution.




