DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located along the south side of Black Road Road, about 1/4 mile west of Maryland Route 66 in Washington County. It is situated on a rise of ground above a small pond and stream and faces north.

The structure is a four-bay, 1-1/2 story stone dwelling with white trim. Modern additions are being constructed on the south side of the building.

Built into a bank, the structure has two exposed stories at its front elevation. The walls are constructed of coursed local fieldstone. Heavy stone lintels are present over some windows.

The windows appear to be spaced at random. At the main floor level, they contain six-over-six pane double-hung sashes set within frames with a beaded edge. Windows at the ground floor level contain six-over-three light sashes as do openings into the attic.

The main door is located in the center bay of the second level of the facade. It is topped with a narrow transom. Another entrance is located at the lower level of the front elevation in the west bay.

A modern, double front porch supported by square posts extends along the front of the house.

The roof is of sheet metal finished with simple boxing at the eaves. A plain barge board faces the gable at the edge of the roof. A small brick chimney rises from inside the west end of the building.

The house is in good condition and stands on property containing 4.24 acres. Nearby are ruins of foundations of a barn.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this house is its architecture. It represents a type of vernacular building in native stone found in Washington County, Western Maryland and the Cumberland Valley. Small houses built without attention to a specific design or style compose a significant number of Washington County's early buildings, particularly those structures with double porches or bi-level entrances in the front elevation.
