DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located along the north side of Beaver Creek Church Road about one mile northwest of Wagner's Crossroads in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on a bluff and faces south overlooking the Beaver Creek.

The building is a two-story, three-bay stone dwelling with white trim. The walls are constructed of uncoursed local fieldstone. No decorative stone work is present over the window or door openings.

The windows appear to be located symmetrically in the facade. Six-over-six pane double-hung sashes are held within narrow frames which do not show pegged joining.

The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. The doorway is very plain, without a transom or decorative woodwork. Another very plain entrance is located in the east gable end.

A one-bay Victorian period entrance porch with a hipped roof protects the front door. A modern one-story shed roof porch extends along the east end of the house.

The roof is of sheet metal which terminates with a barge board set against the house wall. The eaves boxing is finished with a band of molding. Small brick chimneys are located inside each gable end.

The house is in excellent condition and stands on a tract containing .36 acres.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this house is its architecture. It is located in an area along the Beaver Creek where a number of examples of Washington County's early stone architecture are located.

Houses of stone form a significant architectural group in the area, where building stone is abundant. Such structures are worthy of recognition as being a part of Washington County's stone building tradition.


