Description

This building, located immediately south of the Temperance Hall on the east side of North Main Street is a small one story log wash house. It is sheathed with composition siding and has a standing seam roof.

This small outbuilding is said to have been made from the logs of the "old Geeting meeting house and school" where George Adam Geeting preached sermons from 1772. It was the first meeting house of that denomination.




