Description

This two story, three bay house has a stone first story with brick used at the second story level. The stone portion of the house appears very similar to 30 North Main Street, just to the north and the two are, perhaps related. The brick second story, probably an addition of the third quarter of the 19th century, has a central entrance above the main story entrance in the stone section. The entrance surrounds have been reworked. Windows have six over six pane sash and the roof is covered with standing seam sheet metal. Chimneys are located inside the end walls.

This residence is typical of the mid 19th century character of buildings as one approaches the center of town. The 1877 Atlas map lists this property as owned by J. Taylor. The present owners report that the brick section dates from the 1850s and a sided addition at the rear dates from 1902.






