Description

Located at Keedysville's "square" is this ca. 1890 brick dwelling. It is a two story, four bay structure, constructed in common bond with segmentally arched window and door openings. Windows have two over two pane sash with pairs of louvered shutters. A framed semi-hexagonal projecting bay is located at the north end of the front elevation. The main entrance is located in the second bay from the south end and has a segmentally arched transom above the door. A wraparound porch, supported by doric columns shelters the front and south side elevations. The roof is of standing seam sheet metal and chimneys are located inside the end walls.

Like several of its nearby neighbors, this house reflects Keedysville's main period of development in the late 19th century. It shares exterior architectural features in common with 8 North Main Street and the Wyand House at 2 North Main Street. The 1877 Atlas shows this lot as vacant.
