Description

This/ now vacant site held the railroad station for the Washington County Branch of the B&O. The railroad tracks are still in place in part, and poured concrete foundations of the freight station. The site also contained a grain elevator and warehouse. The property is now occupied by a gravel parking area and recycling bins.

The original railroad station was destroyed by fire in August of 1913.





