Description

This L-shaped brick house at the corner of South Main Street and Antietam Drive is a two story, four bay structure. An early 20th century wraparound porch shelters the north end and front walls. The windows have single pane sash within narrow frames beneath segmentally arched heads. The entrance is located in the second bay from the north end.

This house is said to have been built by D.D. Keedy. It does not appear on the 1877 Atlas map.


